

The Court having learned with deep regret, the death of Gen. William H. Winder, a distinguished member of this bar, and being sensible of the great loss, which not only the city, but the State has experienced, in the death of one of her most eminent citizens, do as a testimonial of respect to his character, and in accordance with those feelings of regret, which are every where manifested, order an adjournment, until Wednesday morning next.

Immediately after the adjournment of the Court, the Judges of Baltimore County and Baltimore City Courts, the Members of the Bar, the Faculty of Law in the University of Maryland, and the Officers of the several Courts in this City, assembled in the County Court room, when the Honourable Stevenson Archer was called to the Chair, and Richard B. Magruder, Esq. appointed Secretary. On motion of John Purviance, Esq. seconded by Samuel I. Donaldson, Esq. the following resolutions were unanimously adopted:

1. Resolved, That the Members of the Courts, Bar, and their respective Officers, as a testimony of their deep regret for the loss of their deceased brother, and friend **GENERAL WILLIAM H. WINDER**, and of their sense of the great bereavement, which the public and the profession have sustained by his death, will wear mourning during the remainder of this term.

2. Resolved, That the members of the Bar close their offices until Wednesday next.

3. Resolved, That the Members of the Courts and Bar, the Officers of the several Courts and Students of Law, meet at the Court House, *This Afternoon*, at 3 o'clock, to attend in procession the funeral of the deceased.

4. Resolved, That John Purviance, Thomas Kell, R. B. Taney, U. S. Heath, Charles Mitchell, Thomas Jennings, and Wm. Gwynn, Esqs. be a committee on the part of the Bar, to confer with such other Committees as may be appointed to make arrangements on this melancholy occasion.
