I give and bequeath unto my son Josias one feather bed and one woollen quilt. I give and bequeath unto my grandson Patrick Watts my silver watch and if he should die without leaving issue, I then will and direct the same to be and become the right of my son Thomas Watts forever. I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Coziah half a dozen China Tea cups and saucers to remain in her mothers care after my decease till she becomes of age. I also will and direct that my negro

man Harry be free and have his full liberty at my death provided he will maintain and support his Father during his life. But if he should refuse to comply with this condition, I then will and direct that it be in the power of my Executor to enslave him and hire him out and apply his wages to the support of his Father. All the residue of my Estate after deducting the amount of my debts and funeral expences, I give and bequeath to be equally and impartially divided amongst all my Children. And Lastly I constitute and appoint my son Josias Watts sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th day of Nov^r 1809.

I Conrad Smull of Baltimore County in the State of Maryland being weak in body but of sound disposing mind & memory do make & ordain this my Last Will and Testament. Vizt. Imprimis I do order and direct that my funeral expences & just debts be first paid. Item I give and bequeath to the Corporation of the City of Baltimore as a token of my regard as also for favors received from that Institution my Eight Day Clock & Case thereunto belonging to be fixed in a suitable place in the present Hospital, to be by them kept in repair for the use & benefit of those that may hereafter be occupiers of that building. Item I give & bequeath to Elizabeth Seaman my present house Keeper, for the many services she has rendered me, sixteen feet of the Lot of Ground whereon I now live (& which I leased of Joshua Inloc) on the east side thereof, fronting on the north side of the Philadelphia Road & extending back that width bounding on the said Inloc's line, one hundred feet, with the frame building lately erected thereon and all other buildings, improvements, privileges and advantages on & belonging to the said Lot of ground, for her to occupy and enjoy undisturbed during her natural life. Item the remaining part of the Lot of ground that I now occupy my dwelling house & Lot on Fells Point, as also the Lot of Ground bequeathed to Elizabeth Seaman after her decease with all the buildings and improvements thereon and all the residue of my Estate both real and personal I do hereby order and direct that my Executors hereafter named dispose of either by private or public sale as they may judge most beneficial for the Interest of my Estate & when completed, to make an equal division thereof
