Thomas Brown's Last Will & Testament	Whereas I Thomas Brown of Baltimore County being weak of body but of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding knowing the certainty of Death and the uncertainty of the time thereof do hereby make and declare this my last will and Testament in manner following that is to say First I will and direct that all my just Debts and funeral Charges shall be paid out of my Estate Secondly I give and bequeath to my Dear wife Rebecca all my Household Goods and
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furniture with my Horse and riding Chaise also my two cows together with all my other personal property of every kind and nature whatsoever to her and her heirs forever except a certain leasehold property which I hold on the East side of Eutaw Street as described in an assignment from Andrew Elliott to me having date the sixteenth Day of March Eighteen hundred and thirteen and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore County Court in Lib^r M^e G. No. 122. folio 435th which said leasehold property I give and bequeath to my said wife for and during the term of her natural life only and after her decease I will and direct that the said property shall be sold and the proceeds be equally divided between the whole of my Children share and share alike or if any of them shall be dead the share that would have belonged to said Child to be given to his or her legal representatives.

Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my beloved wife Rebecca Brown my Executors together with Benjamin Elliott my Executor hereby Annuling and making void all former wills as Witness my hand and seal this fifth day of the eighth month. August one Thousand eight hundred and Sixteen
