

R. W. McCullough, Attorney, Ex-Judge

Robert W. McCullough, former trial magistrate of Prince Georges County and a lawyer in Washington and Prince Georges for nearly 30 years, died yesterday in

Providence Hospital.

Mr. McCullough was born in North East, Md., and moved to Havre de Grace after a few years. Graduating from Havre de Grace High School in 1916, he worked his way through George Washington University Dental School and after receiving his degree in 1919 practiced dentistry in Washington for 14 years.

He studied law at the National Law School and graduated in 1929 and engaged in general practice in Washington and in Prince Georges.

Meanwhile, he entered Prince Georges County politics, serving as county campaign manager for George L. Radcliffe in his successful campaigns for the U. S. Senate in 1934 and 1940 and also for Sen. Millard E. Tydings.

In 1950 he was appointed Trial Magistrate by Gov. W. Preston Lane. He resigned in April, 1951, shortly before the end of his term, and filed for State's Attorney. Later, when the incumbent decided to run for reelection, Mr. McCullough withdrew.

He was active in many civic and fraternal groups, and resided at 4614 Addison rd., Beaver Heights, Md.

Surviving are his wife, Henrietta A.; three sons by a former marriage, Robert W. Jr. of Spartanburg, S. C.; William H. of Seat Pleasant, and Richard C. of Kensington; two brother and three sisters.

A funeral service will be held at 10 a. m. today at the Gasch funeral home, 4739 Baltimore ave., Hyattsville, and at 2:30 p. m. Saturday in the Fort Lincoln Mausoleum Chapel. Burial will be in Fort Lincoln Cemetery.
