Linnen what is or may be in hand at the time of my Death
my will is that my Regue Girl shall be free at the age of twenty
three years what will happen in 1711 and I give her Land
of Land to my friend Elizabeth Quinlan and her heirs
I give and bequeath unto my said Regue the Bed to her son
Ley I give unto David and his wife three Bed I give unto
Richard Lithermy Girl I give unto John Jubile my mill
with the appurtenances thereunto belonging and I give unto my wife
my last Gown and petticoats and I do appoint my Son

Watson and her heirs and in Case she die without her I Give the
above said lands and tenements unto Peter Gubardson and her heirs all Children
to be above named Elizabeth Gubardson

Now my will is that my wife to my whole and sole Executors
of this my last will and testament or with any of them and her
heirs
