PHILADELPHIA, June 15.
A Gentleman in London writes his Friend here, by one
of the laſt Ships, that the Great Mr. PITT has the Pre-
ſervation and Intereſt of the Colonies in America to much
at Heart, that thoſe who are not ſufficiently ſenſible of their
Importance, ſay, He is America-mad.
By Capt. Rankin, from Liſbon, we have the diſagreeable
News of a 90 Gun Ship being burnt, by Accident, at Sea,
off of Cape Finiſterre, and about 700 Men loſt in her.
There was an Admiral on board, who, it was ſaid, was
going up the Streights, and proceeded in a 20 Gun Ship,
being the only Veſſel of War he had with him. Some of
the Merchantmen that were under his Convoy, brought this
Account to Liſbon.

On Tueſday laſt Colonel Montgomery's Battalion of High-
landers was reviewed by the Honourable Brigadier General
Forbes, in the Preſence of a great Number of People, whoſe
highest Expectations were fully gratified. The Novelty of
their Dreſs, and the manly and warlike Deportment of both
Officers and Men, was really a fine Sight; and the Time,
Order and Activity, with which they performed their Exer-
ciſes, was not inferior, we preſume, to any Thing of the
Kind ever ſeen among us. In ſhort, the Behaviour of this
Battalion has hitherto been ſo remarkably regular here, and
their Appearance ſo promiſing, that People in general ſeem
highly pleaſed with their Appointment to the important Ser-
vice they are going upon.

The ſame Day arrived here two Store Ships from London,
under Convoy of a Line of Battle Ship, which, after ſeeing
them ſafe in, we hear, ſtood away for New-York, with ſe-
veral other Store Veſſels ſhe had under her Care for that
Place.

In a Letter from Albany, dated the 25th ult. it is ſaid,
that Forty of our Indians have brought in ten French Pri-
ſoners and ſeven Scalps.

And another Letter from the ſame Place, of the 8th In-
ſtant, mentions, that three Days before Sixteen of Captain
Jacob's Company were killed or made Priſoners near Ti-
condewaga.
