Plate as she shall choose which I request she ~~shall~~ <sup>will</sup> accept of as Testimony  
of my Love and Affection for her &c

Secondly, I give and devise unto my Son Benjamin Galloway all  
my Part of that Tract of Land whereon he now lives called and known  
by the name of Whites Plains or Taylors Settlement to him and his  
Heirs for ever &c

Thirdly, I give and devise unto my Daughter Anne Cheston and her  
Heirs for ever all those Tracts of Land which I purchased of John Watkins  
lying between West River and Rhode river commonly known by the name  
of Watkins's Neck &c

Fourthly, I give and devise to my Son John Galloway and his heirs  
forever, all the remaining real Estate I shall die possessed of &c

Fifthly It is my Will and Desire and Thereby direct that all my  
personal Property of what kind soever that shall remain after payment of  
my just Debts and the above Legacy to Mary Kinggold, be equally divid  
betwixt my Son John Galloway and My Daughter Anne Cheston

Lastly, I constitute and Appoint my Son John Galloway and my Son  
in Law James Cheston Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, and  
do hereby revoke all and every last Will and Testament, I may have  
heretofore made In Witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and  
affixed my Seal this twenty eighth Day of October Annoque Domini 1785

Item, I Give to my Grand Daughter Eleanor Leach the Daughter of my said Son James Trott a certain Negro Fellow called Tom now in the possession of my said Son

Item I Give unto my Grand Daughter Kezia Scivener my Negro Woman called Puffs and her Increase

Item I Give unto my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Trott the Sum of Eighteen Pounds common Currency and I will that Kezia Scivener shall pay the said Eighteen pounds to her Elizabeth Trott before the Expiration of six Months after my Decease

Item, I Give to my Daughter Katey Spicknell and my Grand Daughters Sarah and Ann Trott all my Wearing apparel equally to be divided between my said Daughter and Grand Daughters

Item, I Give to my Daughter Katey Spicknell three Pewter Dishes and twelve Pewter Plates together with the Bed and Furniture whereon I lie

Item I Give to my Grand Daughter Sarah Trott one of my Boxes, and I Give the other Box and my Chest to Elizabeth Trott, which Chest is up the Stairs
