Ans^r 2nd - Love and unity appear to be maintained in a good degree as recommended; Falshood, backbiting & spreading evil reports mostly discouraged, & care taken to avoid apparent differences.

Ans^r 3rd - offenders are dealt with nearly as recommended.

The following named friends are appointed to attend the Quarterly Meeting with our report viz, Sam Hopkins, Joseph Cowman, Sam Swinson, Gedra Brooke, Thomas Moore & Caleb Bentley.

The Committee on Meeting lands is continued, friends of that appointment not yet being ready to report.

The friends appointed in the case of Mary Denny are continued under the appointment.

Joseph Cowman on behalf of the Committee appointed to take an opportunity with George Chandler, agreeable to the direction of last Meeting reported, that part of their number attended thereto, and that George did not seem disposed to comply with the decision of a former Mo Meeting in his case, but expressed a wish that friends would bear with him a little longer which being considered, his request is granted, & his case vested under the care of the same committee.
