Be it known, that before me in the state and county aforesaid personally appeared Thomas Simpson and made oath, that he is a resident citizen of this state - that he served as a private soldier in the Revolutionary War, on the Continental establishment - That he enlisted in the service thereof on or about the month of ~~February~~ ^{March} 1776 for three years, in Capt. John Allen Thomas's company, Genl. Smallwoods Regiment, in the Maryland line - That he served out the full term of three years of aforesaid and was discharged at Wilmington, Delaware, by Capt. Davidson; - That by reason of his reduced circumstances in life he is in need of assistance from his country for support.

On this *thirtieth* day of *July A. D.* 1820, personally appeared in open Court, being a Court of Record for said state *Thomas Simpson* aged *65* years, resident in Muskingum county in said state, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare, that he served in the Revolutionary War on the continental establishment, as follows: In the _____ Regiment, commanded by *General Smallwood* _____ Capt. *Thomas's* _____ Company in the *Maryland* Line. The date of my original application is *5th Nov. 1819* _____ and the number of my pension certificate is *16,055* _____ And I do solemnly swear, I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th of March 1818; and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intend thereby so to diminish it, as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March 1818— And that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me; nor have I any income other than that which is contained in the schedule hereunto annexed, and by me subscribed.
