State of South Carolina } On this fourth day
District of Edgefield } of October 1820
Personally appeared in open
Court being a Court of Record for said district
and State Thomas Wiseman aged upwards of
seventy years Resident at Deep Creek in said
district who being first ^{sworn} according to law
doth on his Oath declare that he served in the
Revolutionary War as follows in the first Maryland
Regiment Commanded by Colonel Smallwood in a
Company Commanded by Captain Thomas
Ewins that he is now on the Pension Roll by
virtue of the act of the 18th March 1818 that his
Pension Certificate is dated on the fourth day
January 1819 the Pension having commenced on
the second day of June 1818 and that he has
already received his Pension for the last num-
bered time till the fourth of March 1820
and that the said declarant doth solemnly swear
that he was a resident Citizen of the United
States at the said 18th March 1818 and that he
has not since that time by Sale Gift or in any
manner whatsoever disposed of his property or
any part thereof to the intent thereby so to di-
minish it as to bring himself within the
provisions of the act of Congress entitled an act
to provide for certain persons engaged in the
Land and Naval Service of the United States in the
Revolutionary War passed on the 18th March 1818
and that he has not nor has any person in trust
for him any property or securities contracts or
debts due to him nor has he any Estate Real
Personal or mixed Except the property contained
in the following Schedule (viz)
40 Acres of Black Land of the third
quality which is worth \$50.00

One Man 17 or 18 years old	25.00
four head of Sheep	8.00
One Sow six Shoats & six pigs	15.00

That he has been disabled while in the service of the United States lost two fingers of the left hand which greatly disables him in his old age and that he has a decrepid old wife to support has but one child who is in very indigent circumstances with a considerable family to support and that there is no one whom he can depend on for support or to whom he can look or from whom he can expect any succor

I know ye that Thomas Wiseman
Citizen resident of the district and State aforesaid

God that he enlisted in the army of the United
States in the Revolutionary war in the year ^{1776 or 1777}

and that he fought in the Battles of Long
and White Plains German Town and at Gates
defeat after which defeat he was taken sick
and did not again join the Army during
the war, and that he served faithfully for
upwards of three years and that from the
circumstances of his remaining sick did not
get a regular discharge (this deponent further
saith that he was wounded in the Battle
at Long Island and disabled by having his
two middle fingers shot off he further deposes
and saith that from his various circumstances
in life he needs the aid of his Country for

Madam:

I advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S.39136, it appears that Thomas Wiseman enlisted in 1776 or 1777 and served in Captain Nathaniel Ewing's Company, Colonel Smallwood's Maryland Regiment, he was in the battles of Long Island, White Plains, Germantown, and "Gates Defeat" and served about three years.

He was allowed pension on his application executed June 26, 1818, while residing in Edgefield District, South Carolina.

In 1830, he stated that he was aged "upwards of seventy years", and was residing in Sleepy Creek, Edgefield District, South Carolina, and at same time referred to his wife as old and decrepid and to a child, who had a family, but no names are given.

The above noted Thomas Wiseman is the only soldier

of that name found on the Revolutionary War records
of this Bureau.
