 how soon I may be call'd from this World do I now make and
 publish this my last will and Testament as followe
 Viz I do after my Decease give and Bequeath unto my well
 Beloved sister Elizabeth Ferguson when she shall arrive to
 the Age of ~~Sixteen~~ ^{Sixteen} years all that piece and parcel of
 Land or lott which I hold in London Town situated on South
 River Together with all the House out House Messager and
 Tenements thereon which was Bequeath'd to me by Mr
 Andrew Buchanan late of London Town aforesaid and do
 hereby Desire and Conjure my most and well Beloved
 Mother Elizabeth Ferguson to act as Executrix of the same
 to my sister as aforesaid and that ^{my} mother shall receive &
 Collect the rents and profits of any aforesaid Land and
 Houses & apply the same to the Use of Educating Cloathing
 and supporting of my aforesaid sister Elizabeth untill she
 arrive to the Age of Sixteen Years aforesaid and in Witness
 whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and Seal this Sixth
 Day of July 1701. One thousand seven hundred and twenty six
