

AFFAIRS IN HARFORD COUNTY.—We copy the following from the Belair Union and Argus:

Registration—In this district, up to the present time, there have been registered 90 names, and in the county—six districts—about 500, which will reach we think, in winding up, 1,200—making a total vote, including 1,573 votes polled last year, of over 3,000.

Second Camp-Meeting—A second camp-meeting will be held on East Harford circuit, beginning August 30th, on the old ground at Rockton. There will be divine service the morning, afternoon and night, the following seven days. An army corps of the Baltimore ministers will assist at the meeting.

The Tide-Water Canal.—The trade on this work continues quite brisk. For the week ending on the 20th instant there were towed to Baltimore 67 boats, loaded principally with lumber, and 67 to Philadelphia with like freight; also, 24 to Delaware City and 12 to Spentia Island, all carrying coal; making for the week 197 boats, besides way freight and such as was unloaded at Havre de Grace.

Railroad Mass Meeting.—A mass meeting of the friends of the Philadelphia and Baltimore Central railroad will be held in Belair on Saturday, the 8th day of September, for the purpose of ascertaining whether the citizens of Baltimore and Harford counties will give such aid and support to the construction of said road as will ensure its speedy completion to the city of Baltimore.

Sale of Property.—W. Finney Hinna has purchased the house and lot adjoining the blacksmith shop, in Belair, from John Cox, of Baltimore, for \$1,000.
