

*Military Items.*— During last week there were admitted in the National Hotel hospital 20 patients, and 57 returned to duty. There are at present in the hospital 202 patients. During the same length of time there have been admitted in the Adams House hospital 5 patients, 12 returned to duty and 2 discharged from service. There are at present 68 in the hospital. No deaths occurred in either hospital during the week. Both of the hospitals have been thoroughly scrubbed and scoured from top to bottom, and everything looks clean and neat. The Adams House is now under charge of Dr. Taylor, with several assistants, and the National under charge of Dr. Robert Bartholow, late of Fort McHenry, and is assisted by Dr. F. Townshend Dade, of King George's county, Va.; Dr. B. B. Miles, son of Col. Miles, of the U. S. army; Dr. Knowles and Dr. Dare. The Adams House hospital is now guarded by a detachment of the Fifth Maryland Regiment, who have released the Seventeenth Massachusetts Regiment.

Ludlow, major and aid-de-camp; Gurtavus Von Eckstedt, captain and aid-de-camp; Charles Temple Dix, first lieutenant and aid-de-camp; Wilson Barstow, second lieutenant and aid-de-camp.
