PHILADELPHIA, Mar. 17.
Extract of a Letter from Charles Town in South Carolina, dated January 12, 1752.

"The Cherokees, that were last in Town at the Treaty, committed some Robberies, attempted to ravish several Women, and were otherwise very insolent to the Inhabitants in our back Settlements, on their Return home, tho' they had made a strict League with us. They were way-laid, and attacked by a Party of the Creek Nation, now at War with them, who killed 32, of about 80 or 90 that went from this Place."

YORK-TOWN, March 2.
On Wednesday last a Maryland Officer, assisted by several Men, came to the House of Mr. Martin Kitzmiller, of this County, to arrest him, at the Suit of Mr. Diggs, when a Scuffle ensued: Mr. Kitzmiller called to his Son, in a Smith's Shop a little Way off, for Assistance; the young Man took up a Gun, loaded with small Shot to shoot Crows, and ran to help his Father, when some of the Officer's attempting to take the Gun out of his Hands, it went off, and shot the above Mr. Diggs's Son in the back Part of his Body, under the short Ribs, who died thereof in less than three Hours after. Young Jacob Kitzmiller deliver'd himself up Prisoner here the next Day. The Verdict of the Coroner's Inquest is not yet come to our Knowledge.

ANNAPOLIS.

On Thursday the 19th of March last died suddenly, at her House on South River Neck, to the great Grief of all who knew her, and on Thursday last was very decently interred, Mrs. REBECCA SANDERS, the Wife of Mr. ROBERT SANDERS, Senior, aged 75 Years; after having fill'd with Honour the several Stations and Duties of Life, which Heaven had assign'd her. She enjoy'd, in the conjugal State, an almost uninterrupted Tranquility of 50 Years, and liv'd to see her fourth Generation. She was a tender Wife, a most affectionate Mother, a true Friend, an agreeable Companion, and a kind Mistress. Having a just Sense of Religion herself, she inculcated the Principles of it thro' her numerous Family; and having educated her Children in the Paths of Virtue and Piety, had the inexpressible Satisfaction (which always results from a Consciousness of having done our Duty) to reflect that they were each an Honour to her, and to be convinced that they formed their Plan of Happiness after her laudable Example.

Thursday last died, after a lingering Illness, at his House at the Wood Yard, in Prince George's County, Capt. Richard Williams, formerly a Commander in the Guinea Trade.

The same Day died in Charles County, Mr. Edmund Porteus, Clerk of that County. He is succeeded in the said Office by Benjamin Fendal, Esq;
