The Upper Creeks, having their Arms taken
away, the Night after that whereon the Affair
happened, all fled but one, apprehending the Eng-
lish would take Vengeance on them; but this re-
fused to fly, insisting, that as he had done no Harm,
he apprehended none from them. Next Morning
he was honoured with a Scarlet Jacket, laced, and
sent after the rest, to desire their Return; four
were overtaken and brought back, and, after Assu-
rance of Friendship, were again dismiss'd. We
seem to apprehend nothing farther from this Affair.

The Winter was pretty severe here, having kill'd
some Orange Trees, and affected them much, even
as far as St. Augustine. This Country abounded
in Oranges this Winter was four Years, when
a hard Frost kill'd them all."

ANNAPOLIS.

Friday last *Jamies Powell* was executed at the
Gallows near this City, pursuant to his Sentence at
our last Provincial Court, for a Burglary and Rob-
bery committed some Time ago in *Somerset* Coun-
ty. He was born in this Province, was about 39
Years of Age, of a strong Make and Constitution,
and had the Character of being an old Offender.
Before his Conviction he appeared bold and uncon-
cern'd, saying, that in all the Scripture he ever
read, he never found that God required the Death
of a Sinner; and such he was; but if he must die,
he thought nine and thirty Years was long enough
to live. At the Place of Execution, when Death
stared him in the Face, he seem'd concern'd, own-
ed the Fact for which he was to die, and said, it
had been ramour'd about that he was one of *Per-
kins's* Gang; but he denied that ever to his Know-
lege he had seen the Man, or been within a hun-
dred Miles of his Haunts. After the Minister had
done talking and praying with him, he went to
rise up on his Feet, but fainted away in the Cart,
and lay senseless for some Time, which was thought
to be partly occasioned by his Hands being so hard
tied that the Blood seem'd almost stagnated. On
his coming to himself, he desired the Executioner
to make Haste, and amidst some private Ejacula-
tions was turn'd off.

The same Day *Thomas Hornbrook* was hang'd in
Baltimore County for Horse-stealing.

Last Monday Afternoon, we had at and near
this Place a Thunder Gust, attended with large
Hail, which has done considerable Damage in beat-
ing off Fruit, and tearing Things in the Gardens
to Pieces, breaking some Windows, and killing
many Chickens. About four Miles from Town
the Hailstones were as big as Pidgeons Eggs, and
in some Places were drove up 12 or 14 Inches
high.
