A Description of the Mines of Poland, with the natural History of the several Sorts of Salt.

**THE**

Salt which is used for Food, and use on Sea, is in various Kinds, is in various Sorts, being made by different Methods from Sea-Water.

of Salt Springs; and from hence several Kinds of that useful Common white Salt is made by boiling Water. The Bay Salt is made evaporated only by the Sun's Heat Earth lined with Clay; and white Salt, is made from the Brine of the Sea in Cheshire, and elsewhere in England in the same Manner as the Sea Salt.

The Difference between these is that the Bay Salt is the strongest preserving Fish; the common white middle Nature, and fit for preserving the Basket Salt is the weakest of for eating at Table, having not to fit it for any of the other Purposes a proper Management, the Brine may be made to yield a Salt as the World.

Tho' we have this Variety of Salt for all Uses of Life, the greatest Part only one Sort, which is different and is found lying at great Depths in prodigious Beds, in the Manner of Quarries; from whence it is dug and other Instruments, and then ground in Mills to make it fit for Use.

There are Mines of this Salt in various Parts of the World is that of Poland; from which a great Part of the supplied. Whiska is a small Town in Cracow, and the Mine now worked been worked ever since the Year was accidentally discovered in digging. There are eight Openings, or Drifts, six in the Field, and two in which are the most used for working Men, and taking up the Salt, mostly used for setting in Work.
