LONDON, April

The Legislature having passed a vote in the last Session of Parliament preventing the heinous Crime of thought the following Extraordinary Act of public Utility.

**I**T is enacted, that after the first Term (which begins on the 1st of all Persons who shall be guilty of Wilful Murder, to be executed by Law on the next Day but one, unless the same shall be pardoned, or the same shall be commuted, on the Monday following the execution thereof, that the Body of every Murderer and executed in London, or Middlesex, or the County of Surry, or their Deputies, to Surgeons, or delivered to such Company shall appoint, who are to give a Receipt for the same; and the same shall be ananized by the Company by whom they shall appoint. In the Counties of England, the Judges or Justices shall award the Sentence to be executed the next Day but one after such Sentence, if it be on Sunday as above, the Body of the Murderer shall be taken to the Sheriff, or his Deputy, to such Judge shall direct, to be ananized. Sentence of Death shall be pronounced immediately after the Conviction of a Murderer, and before the Court proceeds to Business; unless the Court see reason for postponing the same; in which case the Sentence shall be expressed not only the usual Judge, but also the Time appointed by the Execution thereof, and the Murderer therein directed for such Offender, to impress a just Horror in the Minds of the People, and on the Minds of such as shall be guilty of the heinous Crime of Murder.

A Discretionary Power is given to the Justice that tries any Murderer, to stay the Execution, if he shall see reasonable Cause to stay the Execution, Regard being always had to the said Act.

The Judge or Justice is empowered to commit the Body of any Criminal to be hanged, but in no Case whatsoever the Body of a Murderer is to be suffered to be buried in any Church, or Church-yard, or any other place; and every such Judge or Justice is required to direct the same to be buried in some place, or to be hung in some place, for the most atrocious Crime.

Immediately after Conviction, a Murderer is to be confined in a Cell or safe, from the other Prisoners, and no Prisoner, except the Goaler or his Servant, shall have Access to any such Prisoner, without the Order of the Judge's Hand or Officer, or else under the Hand or his Deputy.

A further Discretionary Power is given to the Judge, in Case he see Cause, to restrain of such Offender, to relax or to remove the Restraints above mentioned, by the Goaler of the Prison, when he shall see Cause, by License signed or Justice during the Stay of such Execution.

After Sentence of Death is passed, the Body of the Murderer shall be fed with Bread and Water, and no other Food or Liquor, whatsoever, shall be given to him, until he has received the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, in Case of any violent Sickness, or other Cause, for which Case, some known Physician, Apothecary, is to be admitted to attend on him; and such Physicians, &c. shall be bound to attend on him, in his Place of Abode, is to be first entered in the Book of the Prison, there to remain; and if he shall offend against, or neglects to put

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
