Capt. Arnold was going in, he was attacked by a Scout Dotey, and two Pettiaugers, with 67 Men; but he handled them so rough, and killed so many, as soon obliged them to cry for Quarters; which he not chusing to comply with, kepta constant Fire, as long as they stayed by him, and thought one of the Craft sunk in a very little Time after. Don Palmo, their Commandant, was killed in the Engagement, as well as five more, and 7 or 8 wounded, by some Shot from the Cabbin Window, by the Cabbin Boy. One of the Spaniards jump'd over board, and hung by the Ring of Capt. Arnold's Rudder, but was taken in as soon as his Companions were gone. Capt. Hill took a Canoe with five Spaniards (one of which he has brought here) and from Papers found upon them, it was thought they were Spies. He sailed in Company with Capt. Fobes of Rhode Island, and Capt. Ruff of Boston; and left at the Bay, the Capt. Winthrop, Arnold, Sluman and Waynman, all of this Port; Capt. Adams of South Carolina, and Capt. Johnson of Jamaica.

Last Week came to this City, two French Soldiers, who say that 19 more, with an old Indian, deserted the French Forces at Mississippi, and have been 8 Months on their Journey hither over Land: They inform us, that they with many others, were sent from Old France about 18 Months ago, to settle at New Orleans, but not liking the Country, they chose to come this Way; the rest of their Company, they say, are in the Jerseys.

ANNAPOLIS.

At Chester Town, in Kent County, was lately held a Special Court of Oyer and Terminer, for the Trial of one Peter Ball, for the Murder of his Negro Boy, and he was found Guilty.

Last Week arrived here after a Passage of six Weeks from Bristol, Capt. Lorain, in the Ship Chester, with about 30 Indented Servants, and 30 odd of the King's Passengers, to serve Seven Years in his Majesty's Plantations. Capt. Lorain has brought no Papers, nor any News.
