October 6. Our Advices from Holland, for some Time past, are splenetic and full of Apprehensions. The Absence of the Court, with the Uncertainty of its Return; the Misfortune of the Money Scheme, for bringing Interest to two and a half per Cent. and a Suspicion that the Sum drawing out there will be lent elsewhere at that Rate; and the rapid Progress of the Commercial Improvements in the Austrian Low Countries, under the Auspice of Prince Charles of Lorraine, are the principal Sources of this ill Humour, which will hardly be dissipated 'til Things grow better.

PHILADELPHIA, December 7. Friday last JOHN PENN, Esq; (Son of the Honorable RICHARD PENN, Esq; one of our Proprietaries) arrived here from London.
