Since it has been infinuated in somb Letters from Berlin, that a Reply is intended to the British Court's Answer to his Prussian Mejesty's Exposition of Metives, some of our wou'd-be-thought Wits and Politicians have been mustering up all their lit tle Stock of Leafning and Parts, to guess at the Heads of that intended Reply, and after considering the Case in every Light, they seem to be posi-tive, that no Reply can be made, unless the Law of Nations is lest out of the Question; or, to speak more to the Purpose, that while the Law of Nations is appealed to in Disputes between Courts, they may answer, reply and rejoin eternally, without giving the Bulk of Mankind any clear Notions of the Affair.

The Law of Nations, as those Critics observe, is either such Rules and Customs as Kingdoms and Republics have agreed to observe in their Dealings to gether, whether in Peace or War, or elfe fuch as the Strong have imposed upon the Weak, and which by long Prescription have acquired the Force of Law: And this Law, though sounded upon Justice, Equity, Conveniency, and the Reason of Things, may be varied, or derogated from by mutual Agreement between any Powers; whereby it feems, that though it is good in general, yet in par-ticular Cafes it may fometimes be unjust, inconve nient, ogunreasonable, otherwise we should never hear of derogatory Treaties. If then any two Powers may lawfully depart from the Law of Nations, why may not all States do the same? Undoubtedly they might, if unanimous in the Point; but if the Strong find their Account in it more than the Week it is in value to think of it.

the Weak, it is in vain to think of it.

The Law of Nations, they further observe, is in some Respects like the Occult Qualities, invented to corceal the Ignorance of antient Philosophers. In their superlative Doltishness and vain Curiosity they want to know, when this Law of Nations began to take Place in the World? In what Century, and among what Nations did it first appear? Whether it was all at once received, or only gradually obtained, and arrived in a Series of Ages at its prefent Perfection? And to spare themselves the Trouble of turning over antient Historians and modern Selomon fays that much Study is a Weariness of the Flesh, they foolishly recur to the Gospel, and imagine that Christian Kingdoms and States might do their Bufiness well enough without the Law of Nations, if they would only follow the Advice of One infinitely wifer than Grotius, Selden, Puffendorff; All Things what foewer that ye would that Men should do to you, do ye even so to them: Which may be very good Doctrine in Utopia, but does not so well answer the Purposes of Christian Politicians."
