"William Shirley, Eq; late Governor of New Ergland, is appointed Governor of New York, in the Room of George Chinton, Efq; and wil in a few Days embark to take Possession of the said Government."

June 25. Cap. Kip, who arrived here on Tuef day lath, in 14 Days from St. Thomas, informs us, That while he lay there, feven Sail of Dutch Tra ders came in, being drove from Porto Rico by four Spanish Privateers; that foon after, two Schooners and a Sloop arrived there defigned upon the fame Trade, and being inform'd of the Privateers, declin'd going down; but holding a Confultation with the feveral Captairs of the Dutch Vessels, they agreed to sail in a Body against he Spaniards, and ondeavour to force a Trade; accordingly after making Choice of one of the largest of the Dutch Vessels for a Commodore, they set sail; and, seem ingly, from the extraordinary Manner in which they departed, in high Spirits, and with a firm Refolution to drive all before them, there being three Sloops of fix Carriage Guns each, four of eight, a St. Eustatia Sloop of ten, and the two Schooners, one of fixteen, and the other of four; but the next Day coming to an Anchor off Crab Island, near St. I homas's, the Commodore fent his Boat on board each Veisel in the Fleet, with Orders for the several Captains to attend him such an Hour; when, after confulting fome Time, he plainly told them, teat he thought it an imprudent Attempt, and as he imagined he could not answer for the Loss of any Vessel in the Fleet, should an Engagement happen, he purpos'd to resign his Command, and return to St. I homas; and accordingly weigh'd Anchor a few Hours after, as did all the others in the Fleet, fave one Captain Brown, who instantly bore down, and meeting with no Obstruction, had extraordinary Success in Trade: After five Days Absence, he returned to St. Thomas, much to the Satisfaction of all the Islanders, and to the utter Difgrace and Confusion of all the Commanders in

the Fleet that returned.
We are further informed by Capt. Kip, That some Weeks before he sailed, a large Sloop, suppored to belong to some Part of Great Britain, and bound to the Coast of Guiney, her Loading being Brandy and Gin, was run ashore on Norman's Isl and, to the Westward of St. Thomas: That the Crew of said Sloop, being eight in Number, soon after came down to St. Thomas in a Canoe which they had taken the Day before they run ashore, from a Fishing Boat they met near the Island: That they had robbed the said Boat of her Sails and Rig ging, and likewife took a Molatto Fellow from on board, leaving only one Hand behind: That fix of the aforefaid Crew purchased a Yaul belonging to a Danish Snip at St. Thomas, and went directly to Porto Rico: That the Governor of Torsels, hearing of the above Affair, and fusing the color of the above Affair, and fusing the same of the above Affair. hearing of the above Affair, and suspecting fomething extraordicary from their robbing the Fishing Boat, came up to St. Thomas, in order to apprehend the Fellows, but found none but the Boatswain and Boy, both of whom he committed: Upon their Examination, finding the Boatswain deviated much in his Story, he threatened the Boy with the Gallows, when he instantly confessed, that the Sloop was bound from Briftol for the Coast of Guiney, and that the Crew had thrown the Captain and Mate overboard, with a Defign to run off with the Sloop, which they accordingly did, but not agreeing among themselves, the then Captain was determined to run her ashere, which he did on the aforefaid Island. The Governor, after separately confining the Boats ain and Boy, and sending Dispatches after the other six Men, returned to " Tortola.

can By Capt. King, in 16 Days from Coracoa, we learn, That five flout Spanish Privateers were actually fitted out from St. Domingo, to cruize against the Dutch: And, that one of the Coracoa Privateers had had an Engagement with a Spanish Ore, on the Coast of Caraccas, in which she received much Damage, and had four of her Hands kill'd.

From Madeira in fix Weeks we fearn, That the Disputes between the Courts of Spain and Portugal, was likely to be accommodated; the Embargo laid on the Vessels bound to the Brazils being taken off, and several Vessels preparing to fail thitner.
