The Indians burnt the Sloop, and the Articles of Peace before Mr. Castile's Face, and defired him to inform his Go vernor of the whole Affair, upon his Arrival at Ha lifax. Major John Baptift Cope, was Chief, who I have often convers'd with, and always found him firmly attach'd to the English Interest; and 'tis thought the only Motive that could induce the Indians to perpetrate so cruel an Action, was the Lofs of fix of their People, who were murdered and scalp'd by some Persons belonging here, some Time since; and we are much asraid more in-
