

near overturning it. The Governor reproving them they fired a Pistol, by which he was mortally wounded, and died as soon as he arrived at Naples. His Pupil, extremely chagrined, returned to Rome, where he fell sick, and died likewise in a few Days. Yesterday Orders were given for a Party of the Horse Grenadiers, and a Detachment of the Foot Guards, to be on the Parade in St. James's Park this Morning by four o'Clock, to march from thence to the Tower to guard the Body of Dr. Cameron to the Bars in the Minories, where he was delivered to the Sheriff, High Constables, &c. who conducted him to Tyburn on a Sledge, where he was executed according to his Sentence; and To-morrow his Head will be fixed on Temple-Bar. He was well dressed, with a Tye Wig and without a Hat; in his Way, seemed to take Notice of the Populace.

Mrs. Cameron has been confined by Order with her Husband since Sunday last, to prevent her troubling any of the Royal Family or Nobility with Petitions in his Favour.

May 30. Two Men of War, one of 40, the other of 20 Guns, are fitting out, to relieve two others in the West Indies.

May 31. Yesterday was held a Board of Admiralty, when their Lordships were pleased to put into Commission the Wager, and gave the Command to Capt. West.

The same Day their Lordships gave Orders for sixteen additional Shipwrights for Woolwich, fourteen for Chatham, and twelve for Deptford Yard, to commence on Monday next.

By Letters Yesterday from Bristol we hear, that the Colliers are now all quiet, and returned to their Work.

BOSTON.

August 6. Capt. Chandler in a Schooner, which sail'd from hence to the West Indies, about three Weeks ago, was obliged to put back here last Saturday, having met with a very hard Gale of Wind eight Days after he left this Port, whereby he lost all the Lumber off the Deck, and the same Time the Vessel sprung a Leak, so that it was with great Difficulty they could keep her from sinking 'til she got back to this Place.

August 13. On Tuesday last in the Afternoon, his Excellency our Governor arrived from England, in his Majesty's Ship Port Mahon, under the Command of Capt. Montague, which came to Anchor over against Spectacle Island: About five o'Clock his Excellency went into the Port Mahon's Barge to Castle William, being saluted at his going off by the Lannon of the Ship, and upon his Arrival at the Castle, by seventeen of the Cannon of that Fortress. About six he was at the Castle congratulated on his safe Arrival, by several of his Majesty's Council, the Committee of the General Court which was appointed to receive him, and a Number of other principal Gentlemen, who went down to wait his Landing: The Day following his Excellency remained at the Castle; and on Thursday he came up in the Castle Barge, being attended by the Committee and several Officers and Gentlemen in other Barges, and landed at the End of the Long Wharf between twelve and one o'Clock, where he was met by as many of his Majesty's Council, and Members of the House of Representatives as could have Notice of his Arrival, with a great Number of other Gentlemen, and Col. Pollard's Company of Cadets, who escorted him up to the Court House. On this Occasion his Excellency's Troop of Guards, and two Troops of Horse from the Country, with the Regiment of Militia of this Town, were drawn up in two Lines in King Street, thro' which his Excellency and the Gentlemen that attended him pass'd to the Court House; and his Excellency having staid sometime in the Council Chamber, and received the Compliments of the Clergy and other Gentlemen not in the Procession; and being saluted by a Discharge of the small Arms from the Troops and Regiment, was attended in like Form to Faneuil Hall, where an elegant Dinner was prepar'd by the Committee appointed by the General Court at their last Session, to make Provision for his Excellency's honourable Reception: After Dinner, his Excellency was conducted to the Province House by the Committee, Gentlemen, and Military Officers, preceded by the Company of Cadets, who saluted him there with a Discharge of their Fire Arms. When his Excellency put off from the Castle, he was saluted by the Cannon; and during his Passage to Town, the Guns on the Batteries here and at Charlestown fired, as did those on board the Ships in the Harbour. In the Evening there was a large Bonfire on Fort Hill, and a great Variety of Fireworks play'd off: And it was observed, that there was the greatest Concurrence of People on the Long Wharf, and in the Streets thro' which he pass'd,

that was ever seen there at one Time, and a general Satisfaction and Joy appeared at his Excellency's Return to his Government. — On the Day following, the Episcopal Clergy of this Town waited upon his Excellency in a Body, in the Afternoon, to congratulate him upon his Return, as did the Clergy of the Congregational Churches in the Afternoon.

Wednesday last being the annual Meeting of the Society for encouraging Industry and employing the Poor, the Rev. Mr. Cooper of this Town, preached an excellent Sermon before them, and a vast Assembly of other Persons of all Ranks and Denominations, in the Old South Meeting House, from those Words in 1 Corinthis xiii. 5. *Charity seeketh not her own.* — After Sermon 1. 453 old Tenor, was collected (besides the Subscription Money of the Society) for the further promoting that laudable Undertaking. In the Afternoon, about 300 Spinners, all neatly dressed, and many of 'em Daughters of the best Families in Town appeared on the Common, and being placed orderly in three Rows, at Work made a most delightful Appearance. — The Weavers also, (cleanly dress'd in Garments of their own weaving) with a Loom, and a young Man at Work, on a Stage prepared for that Purpose, carried on Men's Shoulders, attended by Music, preceded the Society, and a long Train of other Gentlemen of Note, both of Town and Country, as they walked in Procession to view the Spinners; and the Spectators were so numerous, that they were compared by many to one of Mr. Whitefield's Auditories, when he formerly preached here on the Common.

PHILADELPHIA, August 16.
Extrait of a Letter from New London, in Connecticut, August 8, 1753.

"Lately made their Appearance at this Place, Robert Wall, and Edward Langford, who gave out that they came from North Carolina to the Northward for their Health: But they have since made it appear, their Design was to recruit their Purfes as well as their Constitutions, as they both in Court declar'd. Their Scheme was first to get married: then, as soon as possible, to turn the Ladies Effects, who should favour them with their Hands, into Cash, and shift their Quarters: This not taking Place very soon, and Langford having, as he said upon Oath, Five Hundred Pistoles, which Wall it seems, thinking he had as much Right to, used the Freedom to take them, as he terms it; tho' by the by, the Chest, where the Money lay, was open'd on the Backside, and that by the Help of a Hammer, and some other Instruments. Langford pursued him, and made up the Affair in a very dark Manner: He was afterwards taken at the King's Suit; but Langford gave such an Evidence as could not well be understood; and tho' Wall had Twenty-seven Pistoles taken out of his Shirt Tail in Court, after declaring to the Judge he had no Money, he met with no other Punishment than paying Costs; he and Langford being so nearly connected, that it is supposed it could not be called a Robbery, but a Breach of Trust. As it may be of general Benefit for all honest Men to be guarded against those notorious Deceivers, it will not be amiss perhaps to insert the following Description of them in your News Paper, viz. Langford is a Person of a middle Stature, pale Complexion, much pitted with the Small Pox, has lost one of his Fingers, and Part of another, on his Right Hand; wears a laced Hat, white Cloth Coat, with Silver Buttons, black Velvet Vest, with Gold Lace, ruffled Shirts, Thread and Silk Stockings; and says he left Virginia on Account of his being much in Debt. Wall says he is from Brunswick County, in Virginia, is about Twenty one Years of Age, a genteel made Man, above six Feet high; wears a Cloth colour'd Fustian Coat and Breeches, ruffled Shirts, &c. his Coat rather exceeds the Fashion as to short Skirts. He was advertised in the New York Paper of the 30th of July, (and in this Gazette last Week) by Langford, who there imagined his Five Hundred Pistoles had increased to Fourteen Hundred. Their Schemes at New London were very shallow; and 'tis hop'd, that before they can lay better, Mankind will be aware of them. They reported, at their leaving this Place, that they intended to New York, Philadelphia, &c.

Extrait of a Letter from Barbadoes, dated May 22.

"This Day 70 or 80 Porpoises came on Shore here, in the very Cod of Carlisle Bay, most of them alive, and as People drew them out of the Surf of the Sea, they made a mournful Cry; and what is very remarkable, there has been no Hurricane, nor even a Gale of Wind, no Inundation, or uncommon Influx, or Reflux of the Sea, and what makes it the more remarkable, such an Instance never has

been known in the Memory of the oldest Person here; some conjecture one Cause, and some another; the most probable one I have heard, is that they have been feeding on some Copperas Bank which has poisoned them. The Curious have puzzled themselves a good deal, and are quite in the Dark, as to the Cause of this strange Phenomenon; many prognosticate Sickness, Hurricanes, &c. from it. I am not superstitious, and believe it to proceed from some natural Cause, perhaps the Inhabitants of the Deep have had a Conflict, and those are the Wounded or the Runaways."
