Since he has taken Pessession of his Throne, Order and Tranquility have been restored at Hispahan; Trade is carried on as usual in Julfa, a noted Suburb of that Capital, and the Center of the Commerce of the Armenian Merchants, whose Affairs were greatly disordered during the Troubles of Perfia, and who are now ftri ving to repair their Losses by making the best Use of an Interval of Peace, which, perhaps, will not laft very long.
