We have Advice from Kingston in Jamaica, by  
Capt. Carlisle, who arrived here Yesterday from  
that Island, That the *Sloop Fortune*, Michael Hinds,  
Master, of that Place, sailed from thence the fourth  
of May last, bound for Caracas, and on the 14th  
having sprung a Leak, they were obliged to put into  
Tiberon Bay to rest, but being informed by the Mas-  
ter of a French Sloop, that there was no proper Of-  
fer there, persuaded him to go for St. Louis. Ac-  
cordingly the 19th of May he weigh'd Anchor for  
that Purpose, and at about eight Leagues Distance  
was overtaken by a French Guarda Costa, who took  
him and carried him into Porto Prince, where the  
Vessel and Cargo were condemned, with twenty  
Slaves, and sold at the King's Audience, as a lawful  
Prize, for anchoring in their Harbour, and seeking  
Relief in the greatest Distress.
