faluted him with a Discharge of the Guns of that and all the other Ships in the Port; and as an Acknowlegement of their Civility, he declares to them that he would take Care of their Interests at the Court of his Grandsather. It is thought that he made the same Compliment to the English and Dutch. Letters of the 31st of December advise, that fince his Return to Mo xoudabat he had fent away three Elephants, which he destins as Preients to the Chiefs of the three Nations. He has made good his Promife to the French, by emp'oving his good Offices to get the Ships of this Nation releafed, which had been stopped at Morchia in the Ganges at the Instance of the Superintendant of the Customs; and this Officer has been forced to obey the Orders of the Nabob.

Paris A la main, July 30. We received Advice about five Months ago, that the Ship belonging to the East India Company, called the Prince, which failed for Pondicherry, with Prefents for the Nabob of Golconda, perished by Fire, and that out of 117 Persons who were on board, only 11 fived their Lives. The Account of this Accident was different in all the public Papers in cident was dispersed in all the public Papers, in order to make it feem more authentie; but Let ters are just arrived from Brngal ard Chander. nogor, dated the 26 h and 28 h of December, ad viling, that the above Ship arriv'd at Pondicherry the 233 of Oft bir preceding. Amongst these Letters there are two which men ion the Arrival of two young Ledies at Pondicherry, who, by the former Accounts, were faid to be loft, fo that we are under great Uncertainty with Regard to the Fate of this Ship.

The two Men of War lately retained from the Ceast of Guiney, have brought from that Country two young Princes, as Hollages for the Security of the Treaty which we have renewed with the King of Anamiboa. They are to be maintained at the Kirg's Expence, and educated and brought up according to our Manners and

Lifton, July 4. Letters from Goa advice, that towards the End of latt Year the English blocked np the Port of Surat with two Men of War and filme Frigates, to revenge themselves of the Governor of the City, who had dispossessed them of their Seit'ement there, because they took the Part of the Governor of the Castle, as they thought themselves obliged to do, since their Factories and Magazines were in that Fortres. The Governor of the City having got the better of the Governor of the Caille, notwithstanding he was supported by the English, their Effects fell into the Hands of the Corqueror, who took many of them Pri foners who had not Time to escape on board their Ships. These Prisoners narrowly escaped being massacred, being saved by the Intercession which the French Capuchins, estab istred at Surat, made to the Governor in their Favour. This Affair, however, turned out well for the Dutch, whose nowever, turned out well for the Duten, whole Factories being in the City, they could not avoid affifting the Governor; upon which, after his Victory, he told them, They flould enjoy alone all the Advantages which the English had been possessed of, and that so long as he continued Governor of Surat, the latter should never return there.

The Maltese begin to have their Revenge of the Barbarians, having lately carried to Malta a Corfair belonging to Tunis of 40 Guns, and 320 Men, after a fmart Engagement, in which

the latter had 30 Men killed. Letters from Franckfort on the Oder advise, that the Locusts multiply so fast in that Neighbourhood, that the Country People have resolved to get in the standing Corn before it is ripe, lest it should be all devoured by those Inseas.

We hear from Gratz iu Poland that they are

plagued with a prodigious swarm of Locusts, which have done abundance of Mischief to the Fruits of

the Earth, especially to the Corn.

August 7. We learn by Letters from Madrid august 7. We learn by Letters from Madrid of the 10th of last Month, that the Spanish Go vernois in the West Indies have fent new Complaints to the King about the Conduct of Admiral knowles, lately appointed Governor of Jamaica, who, as they fay, in order to favour the illicit Navigation of the English Ships, have allowed these to treat as Enemies any Guarda-Costas that may attempt to visit them. The said Governors add, that two English Vessels, who were returning from an illicit Commerce at Porto Bello, having met with a Guarda Costa, who asked them such Quef tions as he had a Right to put to them, they gave him no other Answer but a Broadside and then crouded all the Sail they could, in order to get off with their contraband Cargoes. Mr. Keene, the British Embassicor, has been invited to a Conference on the Subject of those Complaints, and the Spanish Ministry have desired him to transmit them to his Britanic Majesty, to the end that Or ders may be fent to Admiral Knowles to mend his Manners, 1sift such Proceedings should be productive of a Rupture between the two Nations.

We are further told, that whilft it was hoped that a Temperament might have been found at Ma'rid, to terminate the Difference that has long fubfilted about the Navigation of the English in the Bay of Honduras, and their Right to cut Log wood there, his Catholick Majesty has blasted that Hope by the following Declaration: 'That the Right of Sailing in the Bay of Honduras is a Prerogative referved to his Crown, which he interds to make his Subjects only erjoy; there forc all other Nations are to be co sidered as excluded from it: And as it is his Intention that this Exclusion shall not admit of any Exceptions whatever, the English cannot complain of being included in it in the same Manner, and on the

fame Footing as other Nations'

Fort William, June 5. Several of the Kings Ships have been cruifing fince March last, off Lo chabar, and among the Western Isles, the Go vernment having Information that Arms, Am murition, &c. were landed in those Parts from France, and some of the Rebel Chiefs returned to the Highlands and Isles, to spirit up their Friends, and enlist Men sor the Service of the Pretender. One of their Captains was shot at Inverlochy, ha ving refused to surrender, and wounding one of the King's Officers; three others furrender'd. The 28th of May Capt. Ferguson, of his Majesty's Ship the Porcupine, took four in the Isle of Sky, and has them Prisoners on board. There are several Companies of the Army in different Places, in Quest of others, most of whom are skulking in the Islands, in order to get off, lest they should meet with their deserv'd Fate at Tyburn.

HALIFAX, (in Nova Scotia.) August 18.
