ANNAPOLIS.

On Monday last his Excellency the Governor, in
Presence of both Houses of Assembly, passed into a
Law, in the usual Manner, a Bill which had passed
both Houses, intituled, An Act for the Adjournment
and Continuance of Talbot County Court.

We hear from Baltimore Town, that some short
Time since, a Woman, the Wife of one Barrett, was
barbarously murdered there; and that he, and several
others, suppos'd to be concern'd in it, are now in
Joppa Jail, and will soon be tried by a Special
Court, to be appointed for that Purpose.

Monday last arrived here, from Rotterdam, the
Ship Friendship, Capt. John Ratray, with about
300 German Passengers, all in good Health.
