W. to Regulate the Market, in the
City of Annapolis.

AS the Market, in the City of
is very irregularly kept, where-
shall not in

by the Inhabitants of the said City, are laid under
several Inconveniencies; For Remedy whereof,

Be it Ordained and Established, by the Mayor,
Recorder, Aldermen, and Common Council, That af-
ter the Twenty fifth Day of March next, Two
Days in the Week shall be held as Market Days,
within the City of Annapolis, viz. Wednesday and
Saturday, and that all Victuals brought to this Ci-
ty, for Sale, upon these or any other Days, shall
be carried to the Corporation's Market-House,
there to be Sold to the Inhabitants, at the stated
Market-Hours, from any Time in the
Morning 'til Twelve at Noon.

And be it further Ordained, That no Inhabitant
of the said City, shall presume to buy, or cause to
be bought, of any Person or Persons, bringing
Victuals to the said City, either upon the above
stated Market Days, or other Days of the Week,
during the Time of the above stated Market-
Hours, that is to say, at any Time before Twelve
at Noon, at any other Place whatsoever but at the
aforesaid Market House, under Penalty of Twenty
Shillings, for every such Offence; one half to be
applied to the Use of the Corporation, the other
half to the Informer; to be recovered in the May-
or's Court, by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint, or In-
formation, Presentment, or Indictment; and if by
Indictment, the Whole to be applied to the Use
of the Corporation aforesaid.

Provided always, and be it hereby Declared,
That this Ordinance, or any Thing therein con-
tained, shall not extend, or be construed to ex-
tend, to any Person or Persons, bringing Fish, or
Oysters, brought by Water to the said City.

A Supplementary B Y E - L A W, to the Bye-Law
entituled, A B Y E - L A W to prevent Acci-
dents by Fire.

WHEREAS this City is liable to many
Accidents by Fire, to prevent which,

Be it Established and Ordained, by the Mayor,
Recorder, Aldermen, and Common Council, That all
Persons, Inhabitants of this City, letting, or enjoy-
ing Houses therein, shall be obliged to provide for
each Dwelling House, or separate Tenement within
this City, within eighteen Calendar Months from
the passing of this Law, Two good sufficient Leath-
er-Fire Buckets, to be hung up in the Passage or
Entrance of such Dwelling House or Tenement,
on Failure whereof such Persons shall forfeit the
Sum of Forty Shillings Current Money, and the
same for every Three Months Neglect, to be reco-
vered by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint, Information,
Presentment, or Indictment, before the Mayor's
Court, the one half to the Use of the Informer, the
other half to the Use of the Corporation, or, if by
Indictment, the whole to the Corporation.

And be it further Established and Ordained, That
every Person renting a House within this City, the
Owner whereof is a Non Resident within the said
City, shall, and is hereby declared, to be under the
like Obligation of providing Fire Buckets, accord-
ing to the Directions aforesaid, and under the like
Penalties, upon Non-Compliance therewith, as the
Owners of Houses that are Residents in this
City are, as aforesaid, to be recovered as
aforesaid. And the better to ascertain, who shall
be deemed Tenants and Landlords, within the
Parview of this Bye-Law, and the Bye-Law to
which this is a Supplement, be it hereby Declared,
That all Persons are liable to provide Fire Buckets,
and Ladders, as Landlords, except such Tenants as
Rent from Year to Year, or for shorter Terms,
whose Landlords are Residents.

And be it further Ordained, to prevent Disputes,
That the Clause in the Bye-Law to which this is a
Supplement, running thus, "Be it declared, That
"all Persons are liable to provide Ladders as
"Landlords, except such Tenants as Rent from
"Year to Year, or for shorter Terms, except also
"where the Landlords are Non Residents," be, and
is hereby repealed.
