Governor Pitts civilly entertain'd them all, until Cast. Ebbets fail'd, which was near three Weeks.

March 18. Capt. PHILADELPHIA. Extract of a Letter from Antigua, Feb. 19, 1754.

"Our Island is in great Distress for Want of Rain, our Ponds, which are the chief Support of our Cattle and Horses, are mostly dry, and many of them have been so for a long Time. One of our Fonds in Town, that has scarce Been dry these 12 Years, has now been he five or fix Weeks; not a Drep of fresh Water in Town, save some few Cifteen, that are carefully locked up, and only used for Drinking water, and that will be soon very scarce and dear, if we are not relieved by the Hand of Prividence; and if this Weather continues, our Crops will be very short.
