Madrid, Jan. 1. The Marquit de Crux, Governor of Ceuta, has disparched a Courier to the King, to acquaint his Majesty, that the 17th of less Month, in the Night, six Companies of Grentiders, and fourteen Picquets of the Girison of The Detachment. that Place, had made a Sally.
