 This Merits your first Attention; and in the Course of our Deliberations, we shall be willing to do every Thing in our Power, to answer your Excellency's Desire, in the other Matters recommended to us; and shall gratefully acknowledge any Countenance or Favour his Lordship may be pleased to shew, towards so necessary and beneficial a Work as a more perfect Seminary for Learning in this Province.
