#### ANNAPOLIS.

We hear from Virginia, That John Wright,  
John Smith, and Toney, the Three Villains who  
ran away with Mr. Creagh's Sloop, after murder-  
ing the Master, (William Curtis) about the Middle  
of March past, are all brought in there from South-  
Carolina, and in Irons on board a Man of War:
