An Att to prevent Perions from Secreting Beats, Flats, and other Vessels, drove by Stress of Wea-ther or otherwise, from Landings or Moorings.

HEREAS it often happens that Flats,
Boate, and other Vessels, are by Stress of Weather, or by Ice, drove from Landings, Moorings, and Harbours, into the Bay, and from one River to another, and are taken up by Perfens who fecret fuch Boats or Veffels : To the Intent therefore that the proper Owners may not be de-

prived of their Property;

II. BE is Enaded, by the Right Honourable the
