Capt. Roffe writes, that a Sloop from London, one Trumbull Master, had been taken at Port Dallia, and plundered of her Cargo, Sails and Rigging, and the Captain with all his Crew carried off by the Natives; but that the Vessel was re-taken by a Lon-

don Snow passing that Way.

The Schooner Two Friends, of New England, John Burges Master, bound from this Port for London, foundered in her Passage; but the Cap tain and Crew saved themselves in their Boat, and met with a Vessel at Sea that took 'em up.
