Traders, viz. Alexander M. Genty, Jabez Evans,
David Hendricks, and William Powell, were taken trading on Kantucqui River, near the Obio, by Party of French Indians, called Cagnawaga's, who plundered them of Goods to the Value of feveral Hundred Pounds, and carried them to Canada where they were made Slaves. But acquainting the Mayor of Albany with their milerable Situation, by a Letter which he communicated to this Govern ment, Measures were taken to procure their Release. The Indians at first demanded a Negre Boy for each of them, or as much Money as would buy one; but at length were prevailed on by the Comone; but at length were prevailed on by the Com-missioners of Indian Assairs at Albany, to take less; tho the whole paid them, with the Charges, a-mounted to Seventy two Peands, Five Sbillings and Three Hallpenes, for the four Prisoners, which Sum has been repaid by this Province. However, the Indians it terms pretend not to be satisfied; and Col. Minders Schweler, one of the Albany Commission Col. Mynders Schuyler, one of the Albany Commif. fioners for Indian Affairs, who transacted this Matter with them, received lately the following Letter from the Chief of that Nation on the Subject, viz.

You know, my Brother, that I had only ninety Livres of our Money. I charge Montander with this Commission, who will explain my Sentiments to you, when he delivers you this Letter. The leaft-that ought to be paid for a Prifoner is 400 Livres. Let those that have the Management of these Sort of Affairs. give das Attention to this Otherwife I will not answer for what may happen hereafter, when my young Men make Prisoners.
