Arguments, and Reasons, freely to inlift for the Protection of our Lives and Fortunes; and to give your Countenance to such Officers that may be commissioned to raise the Levies.

And I heartily defire, Love and Frindship, may subfift among the different Ranks of our People. Your Example, Gentlemen, will be great Encouragement to others; and, I hope, for the future, generous Benevolence will incite every Member of the Community, to a due and just Regard for the Happiness and Peace of the Whole.

I therefore prorogue you to the second Thursday in March next, and you are accordingly prorogued

to that Time.

Havannah, in 24 Days. flerday Week, from the Havannah, in 24 Days, gives us the following Intelligence, viz. That on the 28th of April last he sailed from Coracça, in the Sloop Polly, be onging to Philadelphia, bound to Georgia, and on the 21st of May following, in a strong N. E Gale, he was forced on a Ledge of Rocks called Cajo Romano, about 22 Leagues from Posto Prince, on the Island of Cuba: That after the Vessel struck, himself, together with his Owner, Mr. Griffiths, of Philadelphia, and Crew, finding it impossible to fave her, quitted her, and got fafe on Shore in the Long Boat : That a Schooner from Porto Prince bound to the Havan nah, put into the Place where they landed three Days after, and refused to carry them down, but left a Pilot to convoy them to Porto Prince: That in their Way, to that Place, the Pilot under Pretence of keeping their Boat a Float at Times when they landed, at length push'd her off in earnest, and left the Englishmen entirely destitute of Sustenance, what little they had being on board : That four Days after, observing his Boat at a Diffance, he made a Float of Logs and went to her, when the Spaniard endeavoured to excuse himtelf for leaving them so abruptly, and assured them of being safely convoy'd to Porto Prince, where they arrived foon af er, and were ordered to close Confinement, being first strip'd of all their Cloaths, and al ow'd but little or no Provisions: That they remain d in that Condition ten Weeks, when they were removed to the Havannah, and there again put in Goal : That Mr. Griffiths and himself were foon after examined before the Governor and ordered to Ledgings; and that the former had commenc'd an Action at the Havannah against the Governor of Porto Prince, for the Detention of 391 Putoles which he deposited in his Hands for its Letter Security; and which he assured Mr. Griffiths to return upon Demand, but resused, alledging, That as the Pistoles were Spanish, he intended to make the Property likewise such :- That the Governor of the Havannah promised to use his En deavours for the Recovery of the Money; and that Mr. Griffiths died soon after through the Patigue and iil Uiage he had met with. Capt. Burrows's Crew were afterwards releas'd.
