Capt. Berry has given us the following further Particulars concerning that Affair, viz. That it was on the 27th of August, in Lat. 27, 30. he was taken; that the Pirate Sloop was commanded by one Don Fernando, and had 28 Men; that she was not a large Sloop, as mentioned in our last, that they plandered his Cabbia sist, of every Thing, even Bedding, Books, and Sea Instruments, and then the Hold of Rum, Wine, Sugar, Cossee, and other Goods, to the Amount (with the Negroes) of near 5001. Sterling; that on the 29th they released him and his People, and saffered them to proceed in the Vessel; and that he believes the Vessel and Crew to be the same that Capt. Gilford of New York met with on the 29th of August.

Yesterday came Advice from Port-Royal, that a Spanish Vessel has been for some Time cruizing off of Georgia (Supposed to be the Pirate Capt. Berry and Capt. Gilford lately met with) which plunders every Vessel she comes up with, and has within this Week pail chased two or three that were bound there, almost into the Harbour : That they are apprehentive, if some Measures are not shortly taken to rid the Sea of this Pirate, he will very soon become fo powerful as to be able to repel any imall Force that may be fent after him : And that they are afraid the Juno, Capt. M'Clelan, which has een some Time expected at Port Royal and Georgia from London, has fallen into his Hands.
