22, 1755, at The French are equipping thirty Men of War, with the utmost Expedition, at Brest, and have fix Thenfand Troops in that Neighbourhood ready to em-Thensand Troops in that Neighbourhood ready to make; but this Fleet cannot pessibly put to Sea before the Beginning of April, when Part of the Men of War, and all the Troops, are to be sent to North-America, if our Disserted are not adjusted before, and they can escape our Fleet. The Proposals sour cling the Brittsh and French Disputes in Asia, Africa, and America, brought hither by the French Ambassaden, were statly rejected. And this Day our new Ambassador set out for Paris with our lass Proposals, which if the French will accept, every national Distilt will be amicably adjusted; but if they result them, the Ambassador is to return, and War will immediately begin. Even for the latter Event we are quite ready, with respect to the Disposition of every Briton, to our Finances, and to our Armaments.
