in the True, the shading Strokes being much more  
distant from one another than in the true Bill; the  
Letters in general thro' the false Bill appear larger  
and coarser than in the true Bill; the Letter Y,  
in the Word TWENTY at Top, in the false  
Bill, is shallower in the opening, and longer in the  
lower Part, than in the true Bill; and there ap-  
pears more white in all the Letters in the Word  
TWENTY, in the false Bill, than in the True;  
the Asterism after XX. S. at the Bottom is much  
larger than in the true Bill; the Signers Names  
are done pretty well; the Paper of the false Bills  
is thicker and coarser than the True; and the  
Word MARYLAND at the Bottom of the Bill,  
is mark'd on the Back, instead of being stamp'd  
in the Paper as all the true Bills are.
