The Veffel from Briftel was confign'd to Messieurs Shephard and Cooper in Barbados, and all the Letters to the Merchants gave the same Account, that War was actually declared.

The Day Capt. Coftin left Barbados, they were feeking out for Men to Man a Privateer, who lay ready for failing on a Cruize, and would fail as foon as War should be declared in Barbados, which they every Day expected.

Monday, by the Post, the Publisher of this Gazette, received a Letter from Mr. David Hall, of Philadelphia, inclosing a Copy of a Letter to Benjamin Franklin, Esq; and Himself, (dated at Barbados, June 24th) from Messieurs William and Richard Moore, which follows,

" Gentlemen, " We embrace this Opportunity of advising, that War was Declared at London against France the "18th of May: A Brigantine is this Minute arrived from Briffel in 30 Days, and has brought
