Part of a Letter from a Gentleman at Wintestler,
dated the 15th Instant, to One here, "Lieute-
nant Baker, of the Virginia Troops, returned
the 10th to Fort-Cumberland: He had been out
with Swallows, a famous Cherokees, with 14 In-
dians. About 35 Miles from Fort-Duquesne they
met a Party of 10 Frenchmen, as they were re-
turning from our Frontiers. This Party had
the Day before separated from 60 Shawanese.
After giving the Enemy their Fire, the Chero-
kees threw away their Guns, and ran in with
their Tomahawks! The French lost Six Men,
Five were killed, and One taken Prisoner. The
Prisoner is an Ensign, and Two of the Killed
were also Officers. The Cherokees lost their great
Warrior Swallow, and another of them was
shot through both Thighs."
