Plantations, is done at particular Request.

Jesty's Ships of War, or other Ships or Vessels in his Majeflavor or for his Majefly's Forces, Forts, or Garrifons; any Thing herein contained to the contrary notwithflanding.

At AA to prohibit for a limited Time the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Meal, Malt, Flour, Bread, Bifeuit, Starch, Beef, Porh, Beeen, and other Vittual Except Fish and Roots and Rice, to be exported to any Part of Europe Southeward of Cape Finisterie) from his Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America, welfs to Great-Britain or Ireland, or to some of the said Colonies and Plantation; and to permit the Importation of Corn and Flour into Great-Britain and Ireland, in Neutral Shipt; and to allow the Exportation of Weest, Burley, Oats, Meal, and Flour, from Great-Britain to the life of Man, for the Use of the Inhabitants there.

Barley, Oats, Meal, and Flour, from Great-Britain to the Iste of Man, for the Use of the Inhabitants there.

HERAS the Exportation of any Sort of Corn, Grain, Meal, Malt, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, Starch, Beef, Pork, Bacon, or any other Sort of Victual, from any of his Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America, may, at this Time, be greatly prejudicial to his Majesty's Subjects; Be it therefore Enasted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That no Person or Persons whatsoever, at any Time or Times during the Continuance of the present War with France, shall, directly, or indirectly, export, transport, carry, convey, or cause or procure to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of, or from any of the Britiss Colonies or Plantations in America, or load, or lay on Board, or cause or procure to be laden, or laid on Board, any Ship or other Vessell or Boat, in order to be exported or carried out of the said Colonies or Plantations, any Sert of Corn, Grain, Meal, Malt, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, Starch, Beef, Pork, Bacon, or other Sort of Victual, where the said Commodities shall, or shall not be, the Produce or Manusasture of, or made in the respective Colonies or Plantations from whence the same shall be designed to be exported, under the Penalties and Forseitures herein after mentioned; that is to say, That all the said Commodities that shall be so exported, shipped or laid on Board, or loaded to be exported, shipped, or carried out, contrary to this Act, Sail be forseited, and that every Ossender or Ossenders therein, shall forseit the Sum of Twenty Shillings, of lawful Money of Great-Britain, for every Bussel of Corn, Grain, Meal, Malt, or Flour, and Twelve Pence of the like Money, for every Pound Weight of Bread, Biscuit, Starch, Beef, Pork, Bacon, or other Victual, and so in Proportion for any greater or less Quantity, which shall be so exported, s

hall be to the King's Majefty, his Heirs and Successors, and the other Moiety to him or them that will sue for the same; which said Penalties and Forfeitures shall be recovered in the High Court of Admiralty, or any other chief Court of Civil or Criminal Juridiction, in such respective Colonies or Plantation; and that the Master and Mariners of any such Ship, Boat, or Vessel, wherein any such Offence shall be committed, knowing such Offence, and wittingly and willingly aiting and assissing the number of any such Ship, Boat, or Vessel, wherein any such Offence shall be committed in any such Courts as aforesaid, shall be imprisoned far the Space of Three Months without Bail or Mainprize.

AND be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That it shall and may be lawful to and for any Person or Person, being an Officer or Officers of the Customs, or being lawfully authorized in this Behalf by the Lord High Treasure of Great-Britain, or the Commissioners of the Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, to take or seize all such of the said Commodities not allowed to be exported by this Act, or by his Majessy's Royal Prochamation, or such Order of Council in Pursuance of this Act, as he or they shall happen to find, know, or discover, to be hid on Board any Ship or other Vessel or Boat at Sea, or in any Port, or in any navigable River or Water, so the latent or Purpose to be exported, transported, or conveyed cut of any of the said Colonies or Plantations, contrary to the true Intent of this Act; and also the Ship, Vessel, or Boat, in which the same shall be found, and to bring the said Goods to the King's Warehouse or Warehouses, belonging to the Custom-House next to the Place where such Science shall be made, or to some other safe Place (where there are no sach Warehouses) in order to be proceeded against actualing to Law; and in Case of Recovery, to be divided according to the Directions of this Act.

PROVIDED always, and be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That this Act, or any

PROVIDED also, and be it surther Enasted by the Authority aforesaid, That this Act, or any Thing herein contained, shall not extend to prohibit the Exportation of any of the faid Commodities from the said Colonies or Plantations to Great-Britain or Ireland, or from any of the said Colonies or Plantations, or from any Port or Place in any One of the said Colonies or Plantation, to any other Port or Place in such Colony or Plantation, respectively, so as the Exporter do before the Shipping or laying on Board the same, declare the Kingdom, Island, Plantation, or Colony, and the Port or Place for which the said Commodities are respectively designed, and take out a Cocket or Cockets, expressing the Particulars of such Commodities, and do likewise become bound with Two Sureties of known Residence in the said Colonies or Plantations, and of Ablity to answer the Penalty mentioned in the Bonds, in Treble the Value of such Commodities, to the Chief Officer or Officers of his Majeshy's Customs, or the Naval Officer, or some other Principal Officer belonging to the Port or Place where the same shall be appointed for that Purpose, by the Lord High Treasurer of Great-Britain, or the Commissioners of the Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them (who are hereby impowered to take such Security in his Majeshy's Name, and to his Majeshy's Use) that such Commodities shall not be landed or sold in any Parts whatsovers, other than the Kingdom, Island, Plantation, Colony, Port or Place respectively, for which the same shall be of declated, and that a Certificate under the Hand and Scal, or Hands and Scals of the Collector, Comptroller, or other Chief Officer of the Customs, or if no such, of the Naval Officer or forme other Principal Officer for he Port or Place where the same shall be landed, or such Person or Person as shall be appointed for that Purpose by the Lord High Treasurer of Se the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds, and fuch Cocket or Certificate shall be void and of none Effect; which said Penalties for Offences committed in America, shall be recovered in the same Courts, and in the same Manner, as the other Penalties insided by this Act are recoverable; and for Offences which shall be committed in that Part of Great-Britain called England, such Penalties shall be recovered by Action of Debt. Bill, Plaint, or Information, in any of his Majesty's Courts of Record at Westminster, or before the Justices of Assistance, or at the Great Sessions in Wales, or by Information at any General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County, City, Riding, Division, or Place, where the Offence shall be committed; and in such Suit no Essoin, Protections, Privilege, or Wager of Law shall be allowed; and for Offences which shall be committed in that Part of Great-Britain called Scaland, by Action or summary Bill or Information in the Courts of Sessions or Exchequer in Scaland; and for Offences which shall be committed in Ireland, in his Majesty's Courts of Record in Dublin, or at the General and for Offences which shall be committed in Iriland, in his Majesty's Courts of Record in Dublin, or at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County, City, or Place, where the Offence shall be committed; and for Offences which shall be committed in any other of the Dominions belonging to the Crown of Great-Britain in Europe, in the High Court of Admiralty, or any other Chief Court of Civil or Criminal Jurisdiction in such Dominions respectively; and such Penalties, when recovered, shall be divided in equal Moleties between his Majesty and the Informer; and upon all Actions, Suits and Informations, that shall be brought, commenced, or entered in the said Colonies and Plantations upon this Act, the Offences may be laid or alledged to have been committed in any Colony, Province, County, or Precinct, within the said Plantations; at the Pleasure of the Prosecutor or Insormer.

PROVIDED also, That nothing in this Ast contained shall extend or be construed to extend to prohibit the transporting, carrying, or conveying any of the Commodities herein before mentioned, by Land, or across Rivers, by Common Ferries, or ou por down the said Rivers, or across Harbours where Clearances have not usually been taken, from any one of the said Plantations or Colonies, to any other Plantations or Golonies, or to any Part of the same Plantation or Colony, or to subject the Persons transporting, or conveying, or causing to be transported, carried, or conveyed, any of the said Commodities in Manner aforesaid, to any of the Restrictions or Regulations herein before prescribed, with Respect to such Commodities exported by Sea, from one Colony to another.

PROVIDED nevertheles, That the said Bond or Bonds (if not prosecuted within Three Years) shall be void.

PROVIDED always, and it is hereby declared, That mothing in this Ast contained shall extend to any of the Commodities aforesaid, which shall be cleared out of any Custom-House in any of the Colonies or Plantations before the Twenty-fisth Day of Marchy. One Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty Seven; any Thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

PROVIDED always, and be it Enasted by the Authority aforesaid, That in Case his Majesty at any Time of Times during the Continuance of this Ast, shall (in his Royal Discretion) judge it to be expedient to permit the Exportation of Corn, and other the Commodities aforesaid, or any of them, from the said Colonies and Plantations, that then it shall and may be lawful to and for his Majesty by his Royal Proclamation or Proclamations to be issued, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, or by his Majesty and other faid Colonies or Plantations to be experted from any of the faid Colonies or Plantations, that then it shall and may be lawful to and for his Majesty and the proclamation or Proclamation, or such Orders of Co

within Twelve Callender Months after the Date of such Bonds respectively.

PROVIDED always, and be it surther Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That this Ast shall not extend to prohibit the Exportation of any Rice from the said Colonies or Plantations directly to any Part of Europe, Southward of Cape Finisherre, but that Rice shall and may be shipped and exported directly to any Part of Europe Southward of the said Cape, in such Manner as the same might have been exported if this Act had not been made; any Thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

PROVIDED also, and be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, that this Act shall not extend to any Fish or Roots which shall be exported or carried Coasswife, but that Fish and Roots of all Sorts shall and may be exported and carried Coasswife, in such Manner as the same might have been exported or carried Coasswife, in such Manner as the same might have been exported or carried Coasswife, if this Act had not been made; any Thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

AND whereas by an Act passed this present Session of Parliament, entituded, An Act to probablt, for a Time to be limited, the Exportation of Corn, Malt, Meal, Flour, Bread, Bissent, and Starch, it was Enzelted, That no Person, at any Time before the Twenty-fisth Day of December, One Thoughand Seven Hundred and Fisty Seven, should export, or carry out of or from, the Kingdoms of Great-Britain or Irery out of or from, the Kingdoms of Great-Britain or Ire-land, any Sort of Corn, Meal, Malt, Flour, Bread, Bifcuit, or Starch, under the Penalties and Forfeitures therein men-Moieties between his Majefty and the Informer; and upon all Actions, Suits and Informations, that fiall be brought, commenced, or entered in the faid Colonies and Plantations upon this Act, the Offences may be laid or alledged to have been committed in any Colony, Province, County, or Precincit, within the faid Plantations; at the Pleasure of the Profecutor or Informer.

PROVIDED also, Intaliance is and Floury, in the faid continued and Floury, from Creat-Britain and Ireland; and they are now in great Want thereof, or Person or Persons, to whom any Certificate shall be resturned, shall have Cause to suspect that such Certificate is false and counterfeit, the Bonds shall not be cancelled, or the Security vacated, until such Officer or Officers, or Person or Persons shall have been informed from the Person or Person or Security vacated, until such Officer or Officers, fons, in whose Name such Certificate shall appear to have
