TESTERDAY the General Assembly of Province adjourned till September next, I ing finished the Business of this short but impor Sitting, by passing the following Act, to whis Excellency gave his Assent, viz.

N ACT, granting to his Majest Aid of One Hundred and Sixty Th Aid of One Hundred and Sixty The fand Pounds Current Money, to fray the Expence of raising, cloath and maintaining, for One Year Regiment, to consist of Seven Companies of diers, each to be composed of 100 Men beto Officers, Five of which Companies to be emped as well in the immediate Defence of South ed as well in the immediate Defence of Southrolina, as in the general Service of North-Amer and the two other Companies to be employed wholly in the Defence of this Government; garrifoned at Fort Loudoun; and to pay for Months Provincials: months from the state from the same of Form from and and Three Hundred Pour for fortifying Charles-Town, and repairing strengthening Fort Johnson: And for stamp Orders for the more expeditious iffuing of the Sums, together with the further Sum of Twe five Thousand Pounds heretofore granted to Majesty for the Use of Fortifications; and viding Funds to call in and fink the faid Or within the Times therein limited.

It is faid, that a Society or Association is fo ing, by the Merchants, and others, in Cha Town, every Member of which is to deposi certain Sum, at his Admission, for constitutir Fund (which is intended to be kept up, by Mo ly or Quarterly Contributions, as well in Time Peace as War) from which one or two Vessel War may, upon any sudden Occasion, be im diately sitted out. Different Plans having proposed by different Gentlemen, perhaps s Account of them may not be disagreeable to Readers: Some propole purchasing a good muda Sloop (or Brig) or two, to be complessed with Cannon, Stores, Small Arms, &c. held in constant Readiness to put to Sea, kee a few Men on board to preserve every Thin Order; so that whenever a Privateer appears the Coast, there may be nothing else to do manning and victualling: Others, are for chasing only Cannon, with all necessary Staffmall Arms, Cutlasses, &c. sufficient for file out two Vessels and 150 Men; and for hiring fitting the Vessels when wanted, if then to be I and others again, are only for establishing a R to hire and fit out one Vessel, when there is urgent Necessity for so doing. We have no R at present for more Particulars; but the First posal is generally thought the best, for many jons, but in particular, because it often have fons, but in particular, because it often happ that there is not One Vessel in the Harbour pr to be sitted out, and also, because his Majo Ships cannot at all Times go over the Bar, Consequence of which we need not mention. Country-Gentlemen would join in forming Society or Association, Two Vessels might be fitted out, and alternately cruize to protect coasting Schooners employed in bringing their duce to Market, &c. And it is thought, that Scheme will be well relished by the loyal Col County Gentlemen, who some Time since is Foot a Subscription for equipping a Country of War.
