LEGHORN, August 8.

ON Friday last sailed from hence *Osborne*, with six Ships of War and two Frigates, and a Tender. Next Day arrived his Britannic Majesty's Ship the *Ambuscade*, with French Prizes, taken by Men of War and Privateers, with her own Prize the *Vanqueur*, on one Deck, and 360 Men, which he took on the Deck, after about one Hour and three close Engagements.

Dresden, August 17. On the 9th Instant Waggon loaded with Bread, Meal and went from this City to the Camp about escorted by a Battalion of Grenadiers, a Regiment of Fusiliers of Rohr, a Battalion of Regiment of Lange, and 300 Hussars. The Day early in the Morning, a great Number of Prussian Pandours surrounded a little Town of Frontiers of Bohemia, called Gottleube, a Prussian Regiment was quartered, with to take it by Surprise. The Austrian attacked it on all Sides; and, in the End killed 29 Prussians, and wounded several, but the Prussians having rallied, repulsed the Austrians with great Loss, and made several Prisoners.

The Austrian Army, under Marshal Daun, withdrawn between some Hills and Mountains where they have posted and entrenched themselves.

Rome, August 13. The King of Spain's Survey which he lately caused to be taken of his Subjects; finding the Clergy richer than the Laity, desired Leave of the Pope to lay a Tax upon the former, the Pope which is to be applied against the Moor of War, and towards the Relief of his Subjects. His Holiness has not complied with so equitable a Request, but Mistake should happen in drawing the British might subject it to a Misinterpretation, he the rough Draught to his Catholic Majesty he may make such Alterations and Amendments as he shall think necessary.

Berlin, August 24. The King, by the Position of his Army in Lusatia, stops the Operations of the Austrians on that Side, while the King is still able to face them in Saxony the Communications he has established with the Province can provide for the Security of that Province. Majesty's Foresight in establishing Majesty's Saxony, has proved an ample Supply of for his Army. The Imperial Army is in want of Provisions being very scarce there these three Weeks past very dear, the King kind them being quite exhausted, while they are to get what they want out of Moravia. There is no Appearance of the King's quitting Lusatia, but on the contrary, by every Step he takes, that he stands his Ground, and accordingly has Dresden, Torgau, and other Places, his Troops as are recovered, to return to my. His Army still consists of above 100,000 Men, and as Experience has shown his Troops can stand against a superior it is not doubted but they will be at Head against the Enemy, notwithstanding with which they are preparing to crush the Militia of Brandenburg is ordered Arms in Case of Need, and the same done in Pomerania, where the Inhabitants greatest Proofs of their Zeal for the their Sovereign. Silesia, the Conquest seems to easy to some People, who argue Conjecture, is put into a very proper Sentence.
