They took with them about 50 Labourers and Mechanicks, and after much se arrived fafe at the Place. On Thursday, 8th, they received a Message from Teedyus-(who, with the rest of the Friend Indians, ad out-travelled) intimating, that from fome nation which he had received from Indians et on the Way, he was afraid some of the y were near. Many, however, apprehended Danger, till on the Saturday following, as Mr.

Joseph Croker (who, from a hearty Desire to serve his Country, and particular Regard and Friendship for Mr. Hughes, went up to accompany him) rodo ent on Horseback, with another young Man, to collect the Horses together; when, upon their riding about Half a Mile along the Side of the River, in View of the Workmen, they were sud-denly fired upon by a Party of Indians, who had concealed themselves under the Bank. Mr. Croker was killed dead on the Spot; the other escaped safe. A Number of white Men, and feven Indians, upon hearing the Fire, rushed out, and pursued the Ehearing the Fife, runted out, and purities the Enemy, but they betook themselves to the Mountains, and, by the Favour of the Night, escaped. The dead Body was immediately taken up, and decently interred. As Mr. Croker was a promiting Youth, of an amiable Difposition, dear to his Friends, and beloved by his Acquaintance, his untimely Death, as it is greatly lamented by all who knew him, gives the deepest Afficiation in particular to his Relations. All the rest are reparticular to his Keiations. All the reit are returned fafe, having finished a Number of Houses for the Indians, whom they lest well safed.
