NEW-YORK, June 5. Saturday last the Earl of Halifax Packet Boat, Rand, sailed with the Mail for England. A few Days ago the New-Jersey Forces, of between 11 and 1200, of the likeliest well set Men for the Purpose, as has perhaps turned out on Campaign, passed by this Place for Albany. They were under Col. Johnston, and all in high spirits; their Uniform blue, faced with red, grey stockings, and Buckskin Breeches.

PHILADELPHIA, June 8. Captain Gregory, from Antigua, informs, that he failed several French Privateers were sight in, and likewise some Dutchmen. Yesterday last arrived here ten Transports from South-Carolina, with the Honourable Colonel Montgomery's Regiment of Highlanders on board, and a Convoy of his Majesty's Ships of War the Kingstale and Portmahon. Yesterday the Men landed, and marched to their Camp, beyond New Barracks, when, notwithstanding the Fatigues of their Voyage they made a fine Appearance.

From New-York we hear, that a Store-ship is sent there from Halifax, with Arms, Tents, &c. their Provincials: That the Fleet left Halifax Louisburg on Sunday the 28th ult. and had a fair Wind for two Days after they failed: That Charles Hardy had looked into Louisburg, and in that Harbour but eight Vessels in all, of which were Men of War: That the Land Forces gone against Cape-Breton amount to 14,000 Men all well, and in high Spirits: And that the British have sent no Reinforcements to Ticonderoga or Crown-Point.

Last Night Captain Boyd came up from Montserrat, and advises, that while he was there, a Dutchman was brought in, loaded with Bale of Goods, from Old France, supposed to be very rich, and by the Captains Phoenix and Hamilton, in Privateers belonging to New-York. The Privateer Spry, Captain Spring, is fallen on a Cruise against his Majesty's Enemies. The Consequence of the Promise made by this Government, at the Request of Teedyuscung, to send Hughess and Pawlin set out for Wyoming Monday, the 15th of last Month, in order to settle the Settlement for the Delaware Indians, last Fall. They took with them about 50 Labourers and Mechanics, and after much Fatigue arrived safe at the Place. On Thursday, 13th, they received a Message from Teedyuscung, (who, with the rest of the Friend Indians, had out-travelled) intimating, that from some Nation which he had received from Indians set on the Way, he was afraid some of the Indians were near. Many, however, apprehended Danger, till on the Saturday following, as Mr. Joseph

Joseph Croker (who, from a hearty Desire to serve his Country, and particular Regard and Friendship for Mr. Hughes, went up to accompany him) rode out on Horseback, with another young Man, to collect the Horses together; when, upon their riding about Half a Mile along the Side of the River, in View of the Workmen, they were suddenly fired upon by a Party of Indians, who had concealed themselves under the Bank. Mr. Croker was killed dead on the Spot; the other escaped safe. A Number of white Men, and seven Indians, upon hearing the Fire, rushed out, and pursued the Enemy, but they betook themselves to the Mountains, and, by the Favour of the Night, escaped. The dead Body was immediately taken up, and decently interred. As Mr. Croker was a promising Youth, of an amiable Disposition, dear to his Friends, and beloved by his Acquaintance, his untimely Death, as it is greatly lamented by all who knew him, gives the deepest Affliction in particular to his Relations. All the rest are returned safe, having finished a Number of Houses for the Indians, whom they left well satisfied.

ANNAPOLIS, June 15. Since our last, all the then missing Ships of the Fleet for Maryland, are arrived, except Captain Waring. Charles Carroll, Esq; came Passenger in Captain Bradford, and arrived at his Seat in Town on Sunday Evening last.

We have a Report, that a Packet is very lately arrived at New-York, with an Account that Admiral Hawke had taken Fifteen Sail of French Transports and Two Frigates in the Bay of Biscay. This we mention as a Report, but hope to have it confirm'd next Week.
