 Cleveland, dated from on board the
 Anchor off Embden, March the 21st,

I T is with the greatest Pleasure I acquaint my Lords Commissio Admiralty, of the Success of his Ma in this River.

"The Enemy had not suffered the laid this Year, thinking by that Mean any Attempts for the Recovery of Emb It was therefore with equal Surprise a that they observed the Arrival of his Ma Seahorse and Strombolo; and after hav the Number of their Workmen upon they had begun, they set about raising towards the Sea with all Expedition, be attacked from that Quarter.

"On the 17th the Seahorse and Str chored between Delfziel and Knok, 18th they came to their Station betwee Embden, by which the Enemy saw cut off from all Communication down towards the Sea; but at the same Ti the necessary Preparations for evacuati

"The Garrison consisted of Fre Prince de Deu's Regiment, Horse of General Lusignan's Regim Ditto of the Regiment Bellefont du R Ditto Orleans, Ditto Bourbon Buffet, Austrian Foot of the Regiment of P Charles of Lorraine, and Col. Van P Two Companies of Artillery of 60 Me
