Our last Advices from Albany are, that on Sun-  
day, the 11th Instant, two French Deserters came  
in there, who left Ticonderoga the Monday before,  
and Quebec about the Middle of last Month. They  
said they belonged to a Regiment at Carillon, and  
that the French in general were greatly distressed  
for want of Provisions. That it was given out at  
Quebec, that some Provision Vessels were coming  
up, but were of Opinion the Report was only  
spread to keep up the Spirits of the Troops: That  
Montcalm was at Montreal; only one Regiment  
at Carillon; 200 Men at Crown-Point; and no  
Canadians or Indians at either Place.

From Conococheague we hear, that one Joseph  
Galliday was killed and scalped there about three  
Weeks ago, his Wife and an Orphan Child carri-  
ed off, and his House burnt: That Joseph Brown  
was shot at and wounded by Indians the same  
Day, but being on Horseback got off: That they  
are daily seen in Marsh-Creek: And that Captain  
David Dinwiddie, of that Place, was fired on ve-  
ry lately by some of them, when he returned the  
Fire, and wounded one, whom he tracked for  
about a Mile by his Blood.

Since our last a Snow, under Pretence of a Flag  
of Truce, was coming up here from Hispaniola;  
but it being suspected that the Frenchman was ra-  
ther come for some of our Flour, &c. than from  
any Liking to bring us what English Prisoners  
might be amongst them, and the Privateer Spry,  
Capt. Spring, being then at New-Castle, Orders  
were sent him to seize the Vessel, which he ac-  
cordingly did, and found a Quantity of Sugar on  
board. His Barge met with a River Schooner  
coming from this sweet Flag of Truce Man, with  
21 Hogsheds of his Sugar, which was also taken  
proper Care of. The Snow and Schooner are  
ence come up to Town. A few Seizures of this  
kind, it is to be hoped, will stop these Gentlemen  
from attempting to come up the River Delaware for  
the future.

Last Night Capt. Smith arrived here in a Letter  
of Marque Ship from Liverpool: On his Passage,  
in Company with the Tartar of New-York, he  
took a large French Dutch-man, with Five Hun-  
dred and Fifty Hogsheds of Sugar on board, and  
sent him to New-York.
