PETERSBURG, Ap

SIR Robert Keith, Minister from Prussia, is received at Court with full powers; but the Success of his Mission is not publicly known. The Marshal Apraxin seems to have a favourable Turn, he being permitted to visit, and to keep a Table. The Command that General had under his Commission, weakened by Sickness and Desertion, have been given to raise 35,000 Recruits, it complete. These Recruits have a Repugnance to march to the Army, they have been obliged to chain them, and tie them to prevent them from deserting.

Plawwen, in Voitland, April 16. Divisions of Prussian Troops are in Motion this Way to the River *Elster*, in order to join the Troops under General Meyer, and other Generals of the Empire.

Prague, April 17. General Laudon's Engagement with the Enemy on the 13th, he killed them 400 Men. On the 14th the General sent to the Head-Quarters two Companies of Croats, who had not done their Duty near *Braunau*; and it is thought that they will receive an exemplary Punishment.

Vienna, April 15. The first Column of Troops coming from *Tuscany*, to join the Army under Marshal *Daun*, is arrived at *Austria*.

Stockholm, April 9. The Court has ordered with several Engineers to go to *Wrede* to repair the Fortifications of the *Altenbohm*. We are assured that our Court and the King's have signed a new Convention, whereby they have agreed to join their Fleets in Case the English should appear in the *Baltick*.

Dantzick, April 12. We learn from *thuania*, that they have prepared Measures for the new Corps of 30,000 Russian Grenadiers, which is sending to her Allies; the first of which Corps, consisting of 6,000 men, already reached the Frontiers of *thuania*.

Ratisbon, April 18. 'Tis computed that the Prussian Army in *Saxony* amounts to 25 and 30,000 Men.

Calogne, April 23. We reckon the French Army in the Neighbourhood of the *Frontiers* to 117 Battalions, and 71 Squadrons.

Paris, April 20. The King finding it difficult at present to procure real Supplies for the Expence of the War, which he is obliged to continue for the common Defence of his Allies, has issued a Decree raising 3,200,000 Livres in Hereditary Loans at Four per Cent. upon the Aides: which was registered by the Parliament.

The King has assured the Imperial Army will soon take the Field in good Condition; and that independent of the *Palatine*, and *Wurtemberg* Troops, the Court has in Pay, and a Body of which will certainly march into *Bohemia*, which will certainly keep up an Army of its own Troops, and seriously to set a stop to the past Mischiefs.

Paris, April 24. At the breaking up of the Council held a few Days ago, a Resolution was patched to the King's Minister at *Vienna* to forward some Dispatches to *M. de Clug* at *Carthage*; since he generally said that he is to attempt to take the *Streights* at all Events. It is supposed that the English are turning a deaf Ear to this Resolution, on the Information that the English are turning a deaf Ear to some Coup d'Etat.
