THE proposed Edition will contain all the RIGHTS of ASSEMBLY of this Province in Force or Use, to the Period aforesaid, printed in Folia on a good Paper, and a beautiful new Type. The several Sessions will be distinguished by their proper Dates, Names of Governors, &c. The Titles of all the Acts inserted in their due Order, as recorded in the Secretary's Office, with References to the Records where they may be found; and an Account of their several Continuances, and Times of Expiration or Repeal of such as are expired or abrogated. The Sessions in each Year to be divided into Chapters, and the Chapters and Sections, with Numbers, for the easier Quotation of any Laws in Being. Ample marginal Notes will be printed, with Reference to any subsequent Law, whereby a Paragraph may, in any-wise, be amended or altered; And an accurate Common-Place, or short Alphabetical Abridgment, will be added, whereby the

Whole relating to any one Article, may be easily seen; and turned to in the several Acts at large.
